

The movie shows how the perception of time and memory changes when we look at life through the lens of a camera. The mix of filming styles — from grainy VHS to crisp HD — creates an atmosphere that reflects changes in technology and in the life of the grandmother herself. Through interviews set against a backdrop of shifting events and memories from different periods of her life, along with archival footage the movie creates a multi-layered portrait of the heroine.





Men and Women: In Rites and Rituals / 2006 / 27'

Rites and rituals - for decades, or even centuries - have been fixing in our subconsciousness patterns of behavior that only at first glance seem harmless. To what extent do they correspond to the place and time in which we live? What is their role in shaping gender stereotypes? Wedding, circumcision, beshik-toy and many other rites and rituals of the peoples of Uzbekistan - what roles do they assign to men and women?

The Burden of Virginity / 2008 / 32'

This film is not about how the echo of the sexual revolution of the West, which has reached us, is turning the miraculously preserved remnants of Eastern traditions into decay.

The burden is something heavy, but at the same time important and, therefore, necessary, something we are very vaguely aware of. We do not know why we need it, we do not know how to get rid of it, and when we do, we do not understand what we have lost and what, in fact, was its point.

Speculative Writing.

Artist Talk and Workshop by Sana Serkebaeva

Artist and filmmaker Sana Serkebaeva explores speculative narrative in film and the boundaries between documentary and fiction. She will talk about her film projects and research behind them, her experience in film collectives and alternative art education. She will also offer a workshop on group storytelling.

Participants in the workshop will be asked to think of stories born out of mistakes, mispronunciations, unfamiliar sounds and so on. Speculative storytelling will be presented as a methodology with repetition, slips of memory and continuous, chaotic, undulating or various types of movement.

Sana Serkebaeva is an artist and filmmaker, a graduate of the Royal College of Art with a major in Moving Image. She was a member of the LUX Critical Forum in 2022/3 and is now a member of the Delux Film Collective. Her work has been featured on the online platform FACT, various screenings, exhibitions and festivals in the UK, Canada, Switzerland, Japan, Australia and other countries.
